#### **School Annual Education Report (AER)**

### Dear Parents and Community Members:

We are pleased to present you with the Annual Education Report (AER) which provides key information on the 2021-22 educational progress for Lincoln Elementary School. The AER addresses the complex reporting information required by federal and state laws. The school's report contains information about student assessment, accountability, and teacher quality. For the 2022-2023 school year, schools were identified using definitions and labels as required in the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). A Targeted Support and Improvement (TSI) school is one that has at least one underperforming student subgroup. An Additional Targeted Support (ATS) school is one that has three or more underperforming student subgroups. A Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) school is one whose performance is in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state or has a graduation rate at or below 67%. Some schools are not identified with any of these labels. In these cases, no label is given.

#### **School Summary**

Lincoln Elementary is currently implementing a "teaming" approach in multiple grade levels, now in its third year, aiming to deliver tailored and diverse instruction to students. This model not only allows teachers to concentrate on targeted planning, preparation, and teaching but also fosters greater collaboration among colleagues.

Additionally, Lincoln Elementary emphasizes transdisciplinary learning, particularly in ensuring comprehensive math instruction across various subjects, including special classes. Moreover, a significant focus lies in reading

instruction and support, notably through the Title I teaching method. This involves Title I teachers collaborating with classroom teachers during Daily 5 instruction, a practice known as "push-in," expanding the number of students supported compared to the traditional "pull-out" method. This combined "push-in" and "pull-out" strategy has generated academic data that correlates with increased reading success among students.

#### Process of Assigning Pupils to School

Lincoln Elementary, as part of the Adrian Public School System, participates in a school of choice cooperative agreement with other schools in the county in accordance with Sections 105 and 105c of the State School Aid Act. School of Choice applications are handled through the board office and are handled individually based upon available spots at every grade level.

The process was the same for the 2021-22 school year.

#### Status of School Improvement Plan

#### 2022-2023

The school improvement team at Lincoln continues to convene regularly, dedicated to analyzing, revising, and executing the school improvement plan. Recent changes in leadership have resulted in the inclusion of staff members who had not previously participated, enhancing support for the plan's success. This multidisciplinary and multi-grade level team remains focused on elevating student achievement in reading, writing, and math.

Specifically aligned with the Michigan Literacy Essentials and Michigan Math Essentials, the team concentrates on offering differentiated learning opportunities for all students through meticulous data analysis. Moreover, they diligently support Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports (PBIS) initiatives, continuously reviewing behavioral data to provide targeted support (Tier 1, Tier 2, and Tier 3) to students.

Building on the groundwork laid in the 2021-2022 school year, a primary emphasis of the school improvement plan centers on fostering a positive culture and climate conducive to students' social, emotional, and academic growth. A notable shift involves directly addressing students' social and emotional needs through regular classroom instruction. Teachers now incorporate Social-Emotional Learning (SEL) lessons weekly, with flexibility to review and reteach as required based on observed student needs. Furthermore, educators are actively learning and implementing trauma-informed practices within the classroom, employing strategies tailored to meet the diverse needs of students.

#### 2021-2022

Lincoln's school improvement team continues to meet regularly to analyze, revise, and implement the school improvement plan based on data. Our focus continues to be on reading, writing, and math. Our priority is early intervention in order to give students the opportunity to be successful in school as early as possible, if deficiencies are present. Early intervention is also a focus for social emotional learning and behavior support. PBIS is fully implemented at Lincoln, along with programs such as Love and Logic, restorative justice, and classroom circles.

During the 2021-2022 school year our school continued to focus on direct literacy instruction emphasizing differentiation and making sure all students had opportunities to improve accuracy, comprehension, detail and fluency. For math instruction, teachers fully completed professional development to enhance methods to enable students to become thinkers through number talks and model drawings. This worked to increase the capacity for students to become mathematical learners throughout their school careers.

Our most significant challenge from 2021-2022, and continuing into the present school year is navigating COVID-19 and learning loss, and increased social emotional needs. We continue to get better at this by the

day, offering Social Emotional Learning as a Specials Class, increasing differentiation efforts, and increasing interventions for students.

#### 2022-2023 Specialized Schools Annual Report

The LISD operates the Laura Haviland Program for early elementary, elementary, middle, and high school students with severe emotional and behavioral impairments. 10 students from Adrian Public Schools attended Laura Haviland during the 2022-23 school year.

In cooperation with the Lenawee County Probate Court, the LISD operates the juvenile education program housed at the Maurice Spear Campus.

LISD operates special education classrooms in local districts including classrooms for students with physical or other health impairments and hearing impairments in Madison, and classrooms for students with cognitive impairments in Tecumseh and Adrian. 13 students from Adrian Public Schools attended these programs during the 2022-23 school year.

The LISD PREP Academy provides educational programs for teen parents from Lenawee County. During the student's instructional program, childcare support is provided. Less than 10 students from Adrian Public Schools attended the LISD PREP Academy during the 2022-23 school year.

The LISD TECH Center offers career technical education programs for high school juniors and seniors.151 students from Adrian Public Schools attended the LISD TECH Center or participated in the co-op/work experience program during 2022-23. This equals 43% of the junior and senior population for this school district.

The most recent follow-up of LISD TECH Center students (a 2023 study of 2022 graduates) showed 56.6% were continuing their education. Of those continuing their education, 76.7% were continuing in a field related to their LISD TECH Center program. In addition, 91.4% were working (full-time or part-time) with 5.0% reporting they were unemployed/seeking employment. Of those working full-time, 75.4% were in a field related to their LISD TECH Center program.

The students of (Adrian Public Schools) receive special education services through the Lenawee Intermediate School District (LISD). In addition to the specialized schools, students receive diagnostic testing, school psychology, school social work, physical and occupational therapy, career technical education, special needs training and speech pathology services.

The Lenawee Intermediate School District provides educational services to students from birth through age 26 who have severe handicaps. Students with severe physical, mental, emotional or sensory impairments may receive their educational program at a classroom operated by the LISD. Less than ten students from (Adrian Public Schools) attended LISD classroom programs during the 2021-22 school year.

The LISD operates the Laura Haviland Program for early elementary, elementary, middle and high school students with severe emotional and behavioral impairments. Eleven students from (Adrian Public Schools) attended Laura Haviland during the 2021-22 school year.

LISD operates special education classrooms in local districts including classrooms for students with physical or other health impairments and hearing impairments in Madison; and classrooms for students with cognitive impairments in Tecumseh and Adrian. Thirteen students from (Adrian Public Schools) attended these programs during the 2021-22 school year.

The LISD PREP Academy provides educational programs for teen parents from Lenawee County. During the student's instructional program, childcare support is provided. Less than ten students from (Adrian Public Schools) attended the LISD PREP Academy during the 2021-22 school year.

The LISD TECH Center offers career technical education programs for high school juniors and seniors. 373 students from (Adrian Public Schools) attended the LISD TECH Center or participated in the co-op/work experience program during 2021-22. This equals 35.1% of the junior and senior population for this school district.

The most recent follow-up of LISD TECH Center students (a 2022 study of 2021 graduates) showed 50.5% were continuing their education. Of those continuing their education, 89.8% were continuing in a field related to their LISD TECH Center program. In addition, 85.7% were working (full-time or part-time) with 5.8% reporting they were unemployed/seeking employment. Of those working full-time, 67.4% were in a field related to their LISD TECH Center program.

Local districts operate special education classrooms open to students from other districts. There are two MiCI classrooms in the county that other districts can send students to. One is the LISD MiCI HS classroom at BD and the other is the MS and HS MiCI classrooms at Addison. Beyond that districts do individual agreements to allow students to attend a classroom in another district. (Name of Sending School District) placed no students with (Name of Receiving School District) during the 2021-22 school year.
